

This original 8-inch by 10-inch oil painting on Masonite of Albert Einstein is by the late American artist Herbert Abrams. Abrams was one of the foremost portraitists of his time and painted the official White House portrait of Jimmy Carter. Over the course of his life he created more than 400 portraits, many of which now hang in some of the most prestigious institutions in the country. The piece offered here is unsigned and was never intended to be sold, but Mrs. Abrams decided to part with it to raise money for the Carter Center's programs worldwide.

12. DONALD STEIN CHINA PHOTOGRAPHS



Donald Stein, a leading Emory neuroscience researcher and longtime supporter of The Carter Center, is also an extraordinary photographer, and these are certified giclée prints of his original works. The prints are on fine art paper and use archival pigmented inks to guarantee color quality, accuracy, and detail that capture the original digital image. Each comes with a certificate of authenticity and is labeled 1 of 3. The winning bidder will decide whether to purchase one or both of these limited-edition photographs.

The first photograph is titled "Members of The Cabinet" and features four Asiatic black bears, recognizable because of the v-shaped white patch on their chests. The photograph was taken near Beijing at a zoo close to the Great Wall of China. Captured at just the right moment, each bear has its own distinct pose as it looks out at the crowd.

The second photograph is titled "The Caravan: Somewhere in the Taklamakan Desert, China." It shows a view, from a distance, of a caravan of camels and riders in a vast desert heading toward the lone building on a sand dune.



13. HANDCRAFTED EARRINGS AND NECKLACE SET



For the past three years, the Atlanta Contemporary Jewelry Show has been held at The Carter Center, and artists Carol and Jean-Pierre Hsu have displayed their creations there. This husband-and-wife team is from Berkeley Springs, West Virginia, and the two work together to create aerodynamic mobiles and eclectic, colorful jewelry. The Param (which means *wind* in Korean) necklace in gold, chablis, and orange is 14 inches long and closes with a clasp behind the pendant, which hangs from four 1 $\frac{1}{8}$ -inch-diameter black rubber cords. The matching Kopec (which means *hill* in Czech) earrings are for pierced ears and are 1 $\frac{1}{8}$ inches long including sterling earwire. The set is made of anodized aluminum and accented with sterling silver.

Next is a set of three commemorative plates featuring images of Jimmy Carter. One shows him alone, the second shows him with Deng, and the third shows Carter and Xi Jinping. The keepsakes were created as gifts and given to The Carter Center at the annual forum on Chinese-U.S. relations held at The Carter Center.

16. HIS AND HERS LIBERIAN ROBES



President Jimmy Carter went to Liberia in 1978 for the first official state visit by a United States president. This pair of traditional Liberian robes was given to President and Mrs. Carter on a subsequent trip in 1985. To make the garments, white and black-dyed yarns were woven together to create wide strips of cloth

which have been sewn together to cover the body and arms. Each robe is accompanied by a traditional kufi-style cap that is 8 inches high. The robes measure 48 inches by 70 inches and 51 inches by 69 inches.

18. "BEHOLD" SCULPTURE REPLICA



In 1978, artist Patrick Morelli was inspired to create "Behold." The sculpture is based on a ritual seen in the critically acclaimed television miniseries "Roots," where a newborn is held up to the heavens and told, "Behold the only thing greater than yourself." In 1980, when President Carter signed the bill that created the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. National Historic Site in Atlanta, Coretta Scott King designated a space on the grounds for a larger version of the statue that she had received from Morelli. The 10-foot-tall "Behold" monument, on which this 15-inch by 4-inch by 3-inch version is based, was unveiled on January 11, 1990. Included with the statue is a framed small collage showing photographs of the sculpture and of President Carter and Mrs. King on the day the bill was signed. The matte of the photograph is signed by President Carter.

The only artist to do so, Findel used carbon printing to transfer the photograph to glass and then applied 24-karat gold leaf to the back. 
20. PRIVATE CONCERT BY PETER YARROW



21. HAND-TURNED MOULTHROP WOODEN BOWL

Matt Moulthrop is a third-generation wood turner who uses a lathe and hand-forged tools to turn logs into sculpture. According to his website, his creations can be seen in the Smithsonian Institution, the Renwick Gallery of the National Museum of American Art, and The Carter Center. The wood for this bowl came from a pecan tree that fell when Hurricane Michael swept across the southeast and hit the Carters' farm in Plains, Georgia. After being turned into the initial shape, the wood was treated for several months to prevent cracking. The bottom of the bowl is signed by both President Carter and Matt Moulthrop. A copy of "Moulthrop: A Legacy In Wood" signed by both Matt and Philip Moulthrop is also included. 23. CARVED DRAGON VASE

An elaborate carving of a dragon wraps around the body of a vase produced by the Longshan culture of China, which dates to about 3000 to 1900 B.C. The dark color is typical of creations from the era, which is sometimes called the Black Pottery culture. While the dragon adds texture to the larger part of the vase, the surfaces of the base, shoulders, and neck are smooth. The vase stands 15 inches tall and 6 inches wide and comes with a decorative keepsake box.



On August 9, 1974, President Richard M. Nixon resigned. To date, he is the only U.S. president who has done so. A copy of the letter he submitted to Secretary of State Henry Kissinger is framed along with

his photograph and a small plaque that reads “The 37th Pres of the U. S. Richard M. Nixon/“The Resignation.”” Another unique piece of American history rescued from the California wildfires of 2018, the framed collage measures 24 inches by 20 inches.



Times Books is the publisher of the landmark series The American Presidents. The aim of the series is to present the grand panorama of U.S. chief executives in volumes compact and lucid enough for the busy reader. While only 19 of the 42 books that have been printed so far are offered here, this may well be the largest collection where each book is signed by its author. The list of authors includes Julian E. Zelizer, who wrote the volume on Jimmy Carter, and Sean Wilentz, who wrote the one on Andrew Jackson and currently serves as editor for the series.

This impressive black 12-string Takamine guitar is the same brand as the instrument that Jon Bon Jovi took on the band's This House Is Not for Sale tour in 2017—and on every previous tour for 23 years. Bon Jovi's loyalty isn't surprising, since this Japanese brand is among the world's premier acoustic guitar makers. 




84. ORIGINAL OIL PAINTING BY PRESIDENT CARTER
